toward Spring's light and greening.*

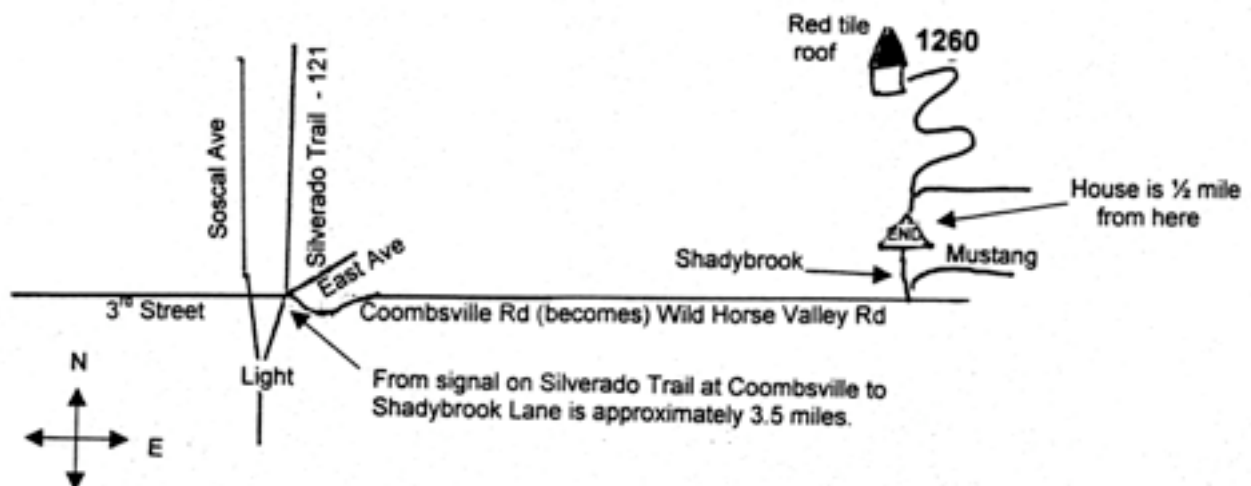

A Message from the UU Legislative Ministry of California Stop the Anti-Marriage Petition Campaign!

We have less than 45 days left to prevent social conservatives from gathering enough signatures to place an anti-marriage-equality constitutional amendment on November’s ballot. The amendment would prohibit gay and lesbian couples from marrying in California.

We need you to help us prevent them from getting the signatures they'll need to qualify for the ballot. UU Legislative Ministry Action Network is joining Equality for All (www.equalityforall.org) and dozens of other human rights groups around the state to volunteer at strategic shopping center locations where we know there are large numbers of "undecided" voters who may be fooled by paid petition gatherers into signing the anti-equal marriage petitions.

Our strategy is not to confront petition gatherers, but simply to ask people to sign a pledge to refuse to sign any petitions that would put the government in charge of telling people who they can or can't marry. Our goal is not to completely stop the petition gatherers, but to reduce the number of signatures they get. You receive good training, are part of a group, and many people will show you their appreciation. High school youth are also welcome to participate with an adult – a great way to model civic engagement with our youth!
